- Would you rather live in a world of uniformity or diversity?

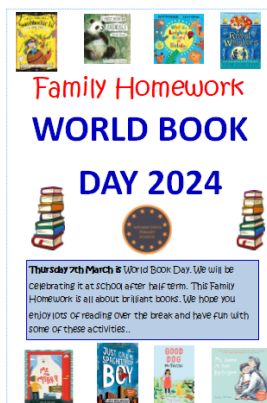
-What is one thing that all people have in common and one thing that is different?
